

## Alumni in the Spotlight Phil Kauffman Class of 1965

Phil Kauffman may have been born in Tennessee, but he was raised in Denver. Phil reiterated, "My Dad was from here, but while in the Army he met my mom in Tennessee. Two months after I was born, we moved back

to Pennsylvania." Here at Cocalico, we are glad his family made that move! Phil started his education at Denver Elementary and continued on through to Cocalico Union, graduating in 1965. Phil played football, basketball, and baseball. During his time on the baseball team, they won back-to-back County Championships in '64 & '65. Although he loved sports, he also enjoyed his high school history and social studies classes. Some of his favorite teachers were Paul Gensemer (World Culture), George Richard (English), and Dan Brensinger (English).

Phil attended Kutztown State College where he played football and baseball. He added, "I wasn't real happy with football in high school, and there were injuries, but I fell in love with football in college. I only lettered one year, but I had a great experience. I knew I wanted to coach one day."

After graduating college, Phil returned to his alma mater to teach social studies. He remembered, "My first six years I taught at the middle school. The last 28 years of my teaching

career were at the high school." Phil loved teaching history. He stated, "I started studying history at eight years old listening to my dad and his friends who fought in World War II. It always amazed me how little most of my students knew about US and World History."

During his time at the middle school, Phil became the assistant football coach. In 1975, when he transitioned to the high school, he became the head football coach until his retirement in 2004. Phil also coached the track team for two years when no one else would step up to do it. He remarked, "Luckily for me, Coach Lauris helped me those years!" (Continued on Page 2)








When asked what he loved about coaching football, Phil mentioned the camaraderie. He said, "I loved working with all kinds of kids and other coaches. I enjoyed watching kids work hard and improve in all kinds of ways. Luckily, we won more than we lost, and we had a few championships." During his tenure, the Cocalico Football team compiled a record of 184 wins and 112 With his guidance, the Eagles won 11 LL League Section Championships and won two District III titles. 



#### Cocalico Alumni Bus Trip Harpers Ferry, West Virginia Saturday May 11, 2019

Please join the Cocalico Alumni Association for a day of exploring, learning, shopping, dining and catching up with old friends. This trip is scheduled for 5/11/19. To get the day started, we will meet our motor coach at the Cocalico High School at 7:45 AM.

The bus will take us to Harpers Ferry, WV. This quaint, 19th century village is bordered by the Potomac and Shenandoah Rivers. The majestic beauty of the two rivers and the cliffs surrounding Harpers Ferry draw visitors from all over the world. The Appalachian Trail goes right through the heart of the town.

Take the opportunity to stroll the picturesque streets, visit exhibits and museums. The architecture of the houses and shops reflect the town's history as a transportation hub 1800 - 1860, a strategic location during the Civil War. Peruse the many different stores for that one-of-a-kind gift. Browse an art gallery, do some wine tasting and buy gourmet foods.

Harpers Ferry is known for the starting place of the Lewis and Clarke expedition; first crossing of the Potomac by a railroad, on the first structural steel bridge in the world; site of the John Brown raid which precipitated the Civil War; Stonewall Jackson, raised and trained his famed Brigade here; site of three Civil War battles; cited by art history experts as the most "painted town" in America, because of its scenery and many much more.

After 5 hours of exploring, we will load back on the bus @4PM and travel to dinner at the Carriage House Inn at Emmitsburg Maryland. Here we will have a meal that will includes a fresh garden salad, fresh baked bread, an entrée with roasted red potatoes and green beans, freshly brewed ice tea, coffee and dessert.

After dinner we will get back on the bus and head for home.

The cost for this trip will be \$85 per person. Includes, deluxe motor coach & tip for the driver, entrance fee into Harpers Ferry National Park, and dinner. This trip is for Cocalico Alumni, which includes all former students and staff of the Cocalico School District, Cocalico Union, East Cocalico and Denver High Schools and guests.


